abstract among the most important values of occupational therapy is the assumption that treatment goals are established collaboratively by therapists and patients there is evidence to suggest however that occupational therapists do not always have their patients goals in mind when establishing treatment goals the purpose of this investigation was to determine the degree of agreement between occupational therapists goals for their patients and the patients own treatment goals subjects were 17 registered occupational therapists and 28 elderly rehabilitation patients in nine nursing homes in western massachusetts data was collected via self report surveys designed by the investigators which documented therapists and patients rank order of seven specific occupational therapy treatment goals data was analyzed for any significant relationship using the spearman rank order rho correlation a significant p
